



Responsibilities Breakdown

As an area, North Springs Monument Young Life believes in finding new ways of inviting people into growth and health and into deeper understandings of what it means to follow Jesus. We want to be open to learning and changing the “hows” of what we do to better reflect the different journeys and needs of the students we serve. So, we are implementing a new Student Leadership model to invite honesty and integrity for all those involved.

We have a vision for Student Leadership in our area being a very intentional pursuit of knowing Jesus through studying scripture, service, leadership training, and a commitment to self-conduct that embodies the example of Jesus. Student Leaders will have the opportunity of accountability to peers, adult leaders, and staff, not as an effort to live perfect lives, but to live honestly in pursuit of the life Jesus points to.

Student Leadership in our area is a great opportunity for students to grow more fully into who God has called them to be. We are however aware that people have unique journeys and may be in a place where they want to be involved, but either time-wise or commitment-wise the Student Leadership description may not be where they are at. We ask all who are interested or seek to be involved in Young Life at the Student Leadership level to enter into it with humility and a willingness to serve, regardless of how that might be.

We will have Student Leader interviews annually before the start of the fall semester as well as on-going opportunities for students to join leadership teams as club helpers.

Responsibilities Breakdown

Ministry

1. **To be an active participant in Club...** inviting and bringing non-Christians, welcoming everyone who comes, and helping organize, plan games/skits, lead songs, etc. Being involved in leadership meeting before club. Helping with set-up and clean-up for club, as well as being a part of strategizing how to invite and bring new students.
2. **To invite and bring folks to Club...** Offer rides, fill car, promote YL at school, and introduce to adult leaders.
3. **To engage in intentional contact work at least once a week at your school...** This may look like going to the cafeteria on Club days, attending the Freshman Football game, etc.
4. **To invite and bring folks to Camp...** The hope would be for a student leader to fill a cabin of 7 underclassmen to Winter Camp and be a student leader in the cabin
5. **To be active participant in Campaigners...** Invite friends
6. **To attend all Student Leadership Meetings and complete all assignments...** These meetings will be held once a month on the 1st Tuesday of the month.
7. **To be a light to everyone at your school...** You are the face of YL in the hallways, classroom, etc.
8. **To pray everyday for your high school/middle school and your friends.** (Ephesians 3:20)
9. **Attend Regional Leadership Retreat (Fall) and Area Leadership Retreat (Spring)**
10. **Are expected to attend Snow Camp and either a YL Summer Camp activity (this includes Summer Work Crew or Alternate YL trips like backpacking, Houseboat etc...)**

Personal

1. To be involved in a growing, maturing relationship with Jesus Christ through daily Bible study, prayer, obedience, and fellowship. (Acts 2:42)
2. To be a regular participant in church.
3. To be committed to live a moral lifestyle based on Biblical principles, such as: abstaining from alcohol, tobacco and drugs, abstaining from sex and inappropriate touching, abstaining from cheating, stealing, law breaking, and lying, honoring your mother/father/guardian. (Romans 12:1)
4. To have a mentorship/discipleship meeting with a YL Staff person or adult leader twice a month
